RUSTENBERG WINES

STELLENBOSCH RM NICHOLSON 2013

INTRODUCTION

This wine is named after a former charismatic owner-winemaker, Reginald ("Reg") Merriman Nicholson, who lived and worked on the farm for 30 years and was the creator of Rustenberg's famous "Dry Red" blend. Just as the Dry Red was an unconventional blend, the RM Nicholson is a new world style blend of classic varieties that would typically not be combined. The result is a blend of Bordeaux and Rhone varietals aiming to express the typicity of each vintage, unrestrained by convention to create great wine. We recommend decanting this wine before serving.

VINTAGE

The vines emerged from a cold, wet Winter and enjoyed even budding in the Spring of 2012. Strong winds in early Summer affected the yields and canopies of some varieties but cool and consistent weather in early 2013 resulted in later than usual ripening. The cool growing season meant the grapes reached their flavour ripeness with low sugars, resulting in medium-bodied, elegant wines being produced.
